### **The purpose of and legal basis for the processing of your personal data**

The University of Copenhagen collects and processes your personal data for research in the above-mentioned research project.

The legal basis for our processing of your personal data in connection with research is set out in Sections 10 and 11 of the Danish Data Protection Act and in Article 6(1)(e) and Article 9(2)(j) of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

Article 6(1)(e) of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) gives the University of Copenhagen the right to process non-sensitive personal data about you without your consent, as the research project is a task carried out in the public interest.



Article 9(2)(j) of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and Section 10(1) of the Danish Data Protection Act give the University of Copenhagen the right to process special categories of personal data about you for scientific research purposes without your consent, where the processing is relevant for the research project.

**Where do we have the information from:**

- We have only collected personal data from you yourself (e.g. via questionnaire or interview, examinations and/or measurements)
- We have collected personal data about you from another data controller (e.g. registers in Statistics Denmark / the Danish Health Data Authority etc.)
- We have collected personal data from you yourself and another data controller (e.g. registers in Statistics Denmark / the Danish Health Data Authority etc.)

**Storage of your personal data**

Your personal data will be stored in identifiable form for as long as is necessary for the fulfilment of the purpose of the project. The research project is at the present time planned to continue until 2030. Thereafter, we are obliged to retain the data for 5 years after publication or for longer, if this is required under other legislation.

Your personal data will thereafter be anonymised / deleted or archived in the Danish National Archives (Rigsarkivet) in accordance with the rules of the Archives Act.

**Recipients or categories of recipients**

Please note that personal data collected for the research project may be processed / disclosed to related research activities, cf. Section 10 of the Danish Data Protection Act, cf. Article 6(1)(e) and Article 9(2)(j) of the General Data Protection Regulation. If so, this will always take place in compliance with the rules of data protection law.

It is also possible that the University of Copenhagen entrusts your information to external processors, including laboratories, apps / IT suppliers. This will likewise take place in compliance with the rules of data protection law, including the conclusion of data processing agreements with the processors, with a requirement that all data be deleted or returned when the processing has been completed, unless continued storage with the processor is required under other legislation or is necessary in order to fulfil legal obligations.

**Transfer to recipients in third countries, including international organisations**

If it is necessary for the implementation of the research project, information may be transferred to recipients in third countries, including international organisations. In all cases, the transfer may take place only in accordance with the provisions of the General Data Protection Regulation, including the requirements for ensuring an adequate level of protection.

**Your rights****You are entitled to:**

– Request that your personal data be erased (Article 17 of the General Data Protection Regulation). The right to erasure may, however, be limited in certain cases, for example if erasure would be likely to make it impossible, or seriously impede, the implementation of the research project (Article 17(3)(d), cf. Article 89).

**Limitations of rights**

The General Data Protection Regulation normally also grants a number of rights that may be exercised in connection with the processing of personal data. When the University of Copenhagen processes your personal data exclusively for scientific and statistical purposes, there are a number of restrictions on these rights.



This means that you do not have the right of access to the information processed about you, rectification of imprecise or incorrect information, restriction of our processing, or objection to the processing of personal data, cf. Section 22(5) of the Danish Data Protection Act.

Data portability (Article 20 of the General Data Protection Regulation), which gives you the right to receive and transfer your personal data in a structured and machine-readable format, does not apply to this research activity, as the information has been collected solely for research and statistics pursuant to Article 6(1)(e) and Article 9(2)(j) of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

### **Complaint**
